

• Information:

• Information:

A <u>levee</u> is a natural or artificial wall that blocks water.

• Information:

The plate <u>boundaries</u> are made up of many faults, and most of the earthquakes around the world occur on these <u>faults</u>.

• Information:

The word <u>petroleum</u> means rock oil or oil from the earth.

Groundwater Pollution

• Information:

Groundwater contamination occurs when manmade products such as <u>gasoline</u>, <u>oil</u>, road salts and chemicals get into the groundwater and cause it to become unsafe and unfit for human use.

Natural Gas

• Information:

Millions of years ago, the remains of <u>plants</u> and <u>animals</u> decayed and was covered with rock. Pressure and heat changed some of this organic material into coal, some into oil (petroleum), and some into natural gas — tiny bubbles of <u>odorless</u> gas.

Mining

Information:

Large-scale mining process can affect the environment through <u>water</u> contamination, affecting human environments <u>miles</u> away from the mining site.

Wood

• Information:

Many manufacturing plants in the wood and paper products industry use <u>wood waste</u> to produce their own steam and electricity. This saves money because it reduces the amount of fuel and <u>electricity</u> that must be purchased.

Peat

• Information:

Peat is a heterogeneous mixture of more or less <u>decomposed</u> plant (humus) material that has accumulated in a <u>water</u>-saturated environment.
